Trees Atlanta Junior TreeKeeper Camp “Junior Intern” (Student Volunteers) Application

Eligible Ages: Students rising into 9th through 12th grades in the Fall

Deadline for Application: April 1 (Roles may fill prior to deadline)

Students can gain volunteer experience while having fun at Trees Atlanta Junior TreeKeeper (JTK) Camp as a Junior Intern! Jr. Interns are supervised while volunteering at JTK Camp. They practice taking on leadership responsibilities while working alongside Trees Atlanta camp staff. Jr. Interns follow the guidance of camp staff and will assist with outdoor and indoor activities, act as role models for younger campers, and learn a bit about our urban forest along the way!

What are the requirements to become a Jr. Intern?

- Complete application, including recommendation letter from current teacher or coach
- Volunteer for at least 2 full weeks of Summer Camp (please indicate desired weeks on your application; review full camp description and weeks at treesatlanta.org/camps)
- Work Monday through Friday from 8:30 am to 3:45 pm*
- Mandatory: strong bike rider (must bring bike, helmet, backpack, and water bottle)
- Enjoy the outdoors and be comfortable in natural habitats, including exposure to animals and/or insects
- Be able and willing to be physically active outside in summer heat, rain, wind, etc. on foot and on bikes
- Past Junior TreeKeeper campers are highly encouraged to apply (must meet requirements listed above)

*Earlier drop off and/or later pick up time may or may not be possible and must be arranged in advance with the Camp Lead (Zach Lim, Youth Education Coordinator).

What we are looking for:

- Great attitude and team player able to help and assist as needed
- Love for the outdoors and nature (we are outside all day rain or shine)
- Mature, able to follow directions well, and behave responsibly with limited supervision
- Enjoy working with younger children and able to engage in age-appropriate interactions
- Prior babysitting or volunteer experience is helpful
- Must wear appropriate clothing for activities, stay hydrated, and bring a sack lunch / snacks (cannot require refrigeration or heating) each day
- Mobile phone use will be limited/restricted during the camp day

You will report to work at Trees Atlanta - TreeHouse (112 Krog Street, Suite #7, Atlanta, GA 30307) and will work in various locations in and around the Atlanta BeltLine, BeltLine Arboretum, and short field trips in the city.
